# Scheduling and Page Restrictions

## Prompt

A [scheduled page](#) has its page restrictions automatically changed. Here's how.

## Reference

When a page (or blog post) is scheduled, view restrictions are added to the page for the users and groups who can edit pages (or blog posts) in that space. These view restrictions will replace any previous *page* view or edit restrictions. If there is a page [workflow](#) applied, please see additional [Scheduling and Workflow Implications](#). When released, the view restrictions are removed from the page.

The table below describes what happens to page restrictions during each phase of the [scheduled window](#) of a [scheduled page](#).

### Scheduled Page Visibility

	Viewing is Restricted	Viewing Restrictions Removed	State of Scheduled Page
<b>Upon scheduling</b> <i>(before scheduled window)</i>	✓		<a href="#">Scheduled</a>
<b>Releasing a page</b> <i>(during scheduled window)</i>		✓	<a href="#">Released</a>
<b>Hiding a page</b> <i>(after scheduled window)</i>	✓		<a href="#">Hidden</a>
<b>Clearing (unscheduling) a page</b>		✓	(see note below)

### Clearing a schedule

If a page has its schedule cleared, any viewing restrictions will be removed (and reset according to the space permissions). You may need to manually re-apply any unique page restrictions to the page.
