Prompt

Display Page and Space Owners, Publish Date, Document ID, and Page Status.

Outcome

The [Page Metadata Macro](#) can be used, and used again, to display special Content Flow information, including status, ownership, and publish date.

Steps

On any page, insert the Page Metadata Macro

In the macro edit window, make your information selections

- [Publish Date](#)
- [Page Owner](#)
- [Space Owner](#)
- [Document ID](#)

Save the macro edit window

In organizations with [publishing workflows](#), the use of the Page Metadata Macro can be especially beneficial. Use it repeatedly in a table to create an easy-to-read set of document information, as follows:

Document Title	...
Document Owner	{Page Metadata Macro with Page Owner selected}
Document ID	{Page Metadata Macro with Document ID selected}
Status	{Page Metadata Macro with Page Status selected}
Official Publish Date	{Page Metadata Macro with Publish Date selected}
Version	...

Then, insert this table into [Confluence's Page Properties Macro](#) in order to improve discoverability and reporting across your documentation.
